Please consider joining us. Knowledge of knitting/crocheting not required!

"The creation and presentation of a prayer shawl, like all acts of generosity, enriches the giver as well as the recipient. Compassion and the love of knitting/crocheting have been combined into a prayerful way of passing on love and joy. Many blessings are prayed into every shawl. Shawls can be used during prayer or meditation; while undergoing medical procedures; during an illness and recovery; while ministering to others; as a comfort after a loss or in times of stress; during bereavement. They also can be used for commitment or marriage ceremonies, birthing or nursing a baby, or as graduation, birthday, anniversary, or ordi-

nation gift. The making of a prayer shawl is a spiritual practice, which embodies our thoughts and prayers for the receiver. It is a gift freely given with no strings attached. Made in prayer, the shawls are passed on hand-to-hand and heart-to-heart. Some work alone, others work in groups, passing the work in progress around a circle asking each person to add some stitches to the shawl, or to just hold it for a while to add their prayers and good wishes. Before giving it away, the shawl is blessed, remembering the one who will receive this gift."

A Hidden Graduation Message



Lectors read the scripture lessons for the day at the 8:30 and 10:45 worship services.

Children's Church meets during 9:30 a.m. worship service in the sanctuary & 1st/2nd grade classroom. Volunteers read a Bible story to the children and supervise craft and play time.

Hosts buy or bake six to eight dozen cookies, and serve coffee and lemonade after the 9:30 contemporary and 10:45 traditional worship services. New Hope purchases three to five dozen cookies to also be served with the hosts' cookies. After fellowship time the hosts wash, dry, and put away the cookie platters, rinse out and dry the coffee canisters, and take the trash out to the trash bin. When you sign up to host, a letter from New Hope will be mailed to you before you host with instructions on how to host.



Imagine No Malaria: Thank you to those who bought tickets to the Imagine No Malaria Pancake Breakfast fundraiser, April 27th. We will continue raising funds at New Hope to fulfill our pledge commitment of \$1,200 for the elimination of Malaria deaths by 2015 mostly funded by the United Methodist Church.



Please visit our display by the Mission Table where you can donate toward our goal. Note that \$10 will buy a net to prevent mosquito bites, and \$28 will also include medication and education to prevent at least one death by Malaria. Place your donation in the wooden box in the display, sign a post-it-note and place on the display board, then pick up a wristband to wear to remind yourself how you have saved a life(lives) from Malaria.

Here is information about Malaria from our UMC Imagine No Malaria website. Every 60 seconds, malaria claims a life in Africa. It kills an estimated 655,000

people each year, most of them children under 5 and pregnant women. Transmitted through the bite of a female anopheles mosquito, malaria is a parasite that initially causes fever, vomiting and joint pain. Left untreated, its symptoms progress to convulsions, organ failure and death. Yet, malaria is 100% preventable, treatable and beatable! Imagine No Malaria is an extraordinary effort of the people of The United Methodist Church, putting our faith into action to end preventable deaths by malaria in Africa, especially the death of a child or a mother. Achieving this goal requires an integrated strategy against the disease.

Fact: In 2010, there were an estimated 216 million cases of malaria causing 655,000 deaths, mostly among African children younger than five.

Fact: Every 60 seconds, malaria claims an innocent life in Africa.

Fact: Malaria is a life-threatening disease caused by parasites that are transmitted to people through the bites of infected female *Anopheles* mosquitoes.

Fact: Malaria symptoms appear seven days or more (usually 10–15 days) after the infective mosquito bite. The first symptoms include fever, headache, chills and vomiting. If not treated within 24 hours, malaria can progress to severe illness often leading to death.

Fact: More than 85% of the world's malaria deaths are in Africa.

Fact: Malaria is preventable and curable. Increased malaria prevention and control measures are dramatically reducing the malaria burden in many places.

Fact: Malaria mortality rates have fallen by more than 25% globally since 2000.

Fact: There are currently no licensed vaccines against malaria. One research vaccine, known as RTS,S/AS01, is most advanced. This vaccine is currently being evaluated in a large clinical trial in 7 countries in Africa.

Fact: The United Methodist Church has more than 300 hospitals, clinics and health posts in Africa, all part of a comprehensive program to fight this killer disease.

Fact: Prior to 1951, Malaria was a serious public health problem in the United States—in fact, it led to the creation of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). An comprehensive effort from 1947-1951 virtually eradicated malaria in the US.

Special Finance Campaign

We are planning a special finance campaign for May entitled "Mission: New Hope." We shared in the April 7 worship service that we are projecting a shortfall this year, and we want to be proactive in addressing this need. Our mission statement is to: "Serve God, Love Others, and Follow Jesus Christ." The reason that we are making this special appeal is that we, in fact, are fulfilling our mission in many ways, but our ministries are growing faster than our giving.

We are being successful in introducing people to God, and in helping people grow in their relationship to God. We received 18 new members on April 7. We confirmed 13 Confirmation youth on April 14. Our Johnston River of Life ministry is growing, touching new lives in the Johnston area and serving the community. We have active youth groups and children's ministries. Our giving to missions last year was higher than ever. We have active adult classes and small groups. We are being successful in fulfilling our mission statement. But we need your help as our ministries expand.

Members of the church will be receiving a letter that will provide further information, describe the campaign and ask for your help. We have entitled our campaign "Mission: New Hope" because we are currently in a time of expanding our ministry to touch lives, to reach out, to care for people inside and outside of our church, and to feed hungry souls. We are asking for your help in keeping the momentum of our ministries going. And we invite your prayers for God to continue to lead us to fulfill His ministry.

Nothing Can Separate Us from GOOS LOVE

For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

- Romans 8:38-39

I am writing this two days after the bombings at the Boston Marathon. I heard on the radio today an interview of a clinical psychologist who has done a lot of research of the after effects of such a major traumatic event. He said that such an event affects not only those injured or those who were present on the scene, but it also affects those who saw it on TV or read about it in the news. Such events affect us consciously and subconsciously as well. In the immediate time after the event, we are faced with a fact we would just as soon avoid – the fact of our own mortality. It strikes us how quickly our life could end. We usually try to push this thought out of our thinking, but such a major event brings the fact of death to the forefront of our consciousness. The psychologist said that eventually we are able to push that thought out of our consciousness, but the effects on our subconscious are longer lasting. In their studies after September 11, 2001, the psychologists found that for months after, people tended to interpret life in more negative ways, tended to be more judgmental toward others different from them, and tended to be more skeptical about the problems in the world and possible solutions.

We do live in a world that can sometimes be dark and violent, in which we confront sin and death. The early Christians, who often were confronted by persecution

and violent death, would say, "Of course there is evil, sin, darkness, and death. We live in a fallen world." But they would also remind us that our faith began in a graveyard. But our faith does not end there. We are the Easter people, the people of the open tomb. Even though we may be reminded of the fact of death and even struggle from time to time with our fear of death, this is not the last word. Death has no ultimate power over us. We may trust that Jesus, who has conquered death itself, is with us each day, and can give us the power to live our lives in confident hope.

Rick Warren, in one of his blogs after the suicide of his son, said that the things that have been helping him to cope are the Christian community around him, and prayer and worship at church. He said," When in pain, pray. When you worry, worship."

In May, our sermon series is entitled "Invited." We will be exploring the ways in which Jesus invites us to the hope and confidence of the Gospel. I invite you to come and hear the Good News we have in Jesus Christ, and to invite someone else to hear the hope, faith and life we have in Jesus Christ.
