

Rev. Dr. Lilian Gallo Seagren Appointed to New Hope UMC

As you know, Pastor Jon announced his intent to retire in June this year. We have been blessed by his ministry and leadership.



The SPRC is pleased to announce, Bishop Laurie Haller and her appointive cabinet have appointed Rev. Dr. Lilian Gallo Seagren, Southeast District Superintendent, to become the pastor of New Hope United Methodist Church beginning on July 1 of this year.

For the past 7 years, Pastor Lilian has served as the Conference Superintendent, Southeast District. Prior to that, she was Pastor of the Kimball Avenue UMC in Waterloo 2009-2012, Guthrie Center UMC 2002-2009 and Hamburg UMC 1997-2002.

Prior to entering the ministry, she received:

Bachelor of Science in Social Work – 1981 - Philippine Christian University, Manila, Philippines Graduate Diploma in Social Welfare Administration – 1987 – University of the Philippines

She then received her Master of *Divinity* – 1992 – Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary Evanston, Illinois and then a *Doctor of Philosophy in Pastoral Care and Counseling* – 1995

from Christian Bible College and Seminary in Independence, Missouri.

She met her husband, Kirk Seagren, a retired pastor, while at Garrett and they married in 1990. They have two daughters, Maria who lives in the Philippines with her husband and two children, and their younger daughter, Jane Anne who lives in New York.

Her passion in ministry is "raising, supporting and partnering with Christian disciples who are making a difference in their churches, communities and the world."

A farewell reception will be held for Pastor Jon and Anita in June and a welcome reception for Rev. Lilian and Kirk will be held in July. More details will soon follow.

In the meantime, we will continue to work with Pastor Jon until the end of June and will prepare our church for a grace-filled transition as we then welcome Rev. Lilian.







February 2019 MISSION NEWS

UGANDA CHICKEN PROJECT: Thank you, New Hope! You have donated a total of \$4,582.50, so with the forthcoming \$500 Conference Grant, our total will exceed our goal of \$5,000, by \$82.50!

Patrick has returned from Uganda and supervising this project. He saw a need for immediate cash flow, so used some of the money to buy 2 new motorcycles to be used for a taxi service. From the proceeds will come a small salary to the drivers, and a steady income to continue the project. He also bought a small mowing machine to use for cutting grasses for the chickens, and to be rented out by parishioners.

A church member has loaned, free of charge, a building he had built for chickens, but ran out of money. This will be used as a brooder house for young chickens and then enlarged to house the laying hens. The local Veterinarian advised taking a month to sanitize and then start small with 100 baby chicks to start, then a couple months later, another 100, etc.

The local congregation of this Church of Uganda was so delighted with the gifts of the motorcycles, mowing machine, and Chicken support, so they held a great celebration to thank Patrick and our church. We will be sharing more about this celebration and the project later with the puppet troupe and their chicken puppets. Stay tuned!

DMARC: We continue to highlight our local food pantries through the Des Moines Religious Council. Remember that the third Sunday is designated as Food Pantry Sunday, so we invite you to make a special offering to them through our church by writing DMARC on the memo line and put the check in the offering plate. Winter is an especially needy time for the poor, who are often laid off summer jobs or who work several jobs just to pay the rent, etc. Choices need to be made as to what bills to pay, and there is often not enough to buy an adequate amount of food for the family.

Thanks to Jackie Johnson for organizing the "Souper Bowl" again this year. All soup went to the food pantries, too. And thanks for participating in this light-hearted game to bring in more food for the hungry.

Our Women's Fellowship continues to collect personal items in a basket on the Mission Table and volunteering at Bidwell Riverside, the largest food pantry and clothing closet in Des Moines.

2019 BUDGET: Since going to the unified budget, where Missions is no longer an item on the pledge card, our budgeted amount has dwindled, so giving has had to be curtailed. This year, because of annual shortfalls, we will be funded by the special events fund such as the Rummage Sale, and the Harvest Dinner & Auction. Because our church also depends on these funds for special projects, and future proceeds are uncertain, our Mission Team will have much less to work with.

New Hope has always been very Mission conscious and a generous giving community, so we are praying that we will be able to continue helping and partnering with the many groups and missions as before.

CHURCH CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS: We have provided half of the registration costs in the past years, but we will need some outside help to continue helping our young people experience a life-changing Christian experience at camp. We are hoping to support each camper ½ or up to \$200 toward their fees, depending on their total cost. If you feel led to help in any way to make this happen, please write a check with camps on the memo line and it will be put in a fund to support our children.

New Hope UMC Congregation, you may have heard that the Board of Trustees would like to make significant updates to the main entrance hallways and the Fellowship Hall, including new paint, a mural inside the east entrance, and new flooring. The existing tile in those areas is the original tile from 1965. They are asbestos, and would cost a fortune to remove. The Trustees have found a Trustees wender with a product that can be laid over the existing tile. It is slip-resistant, long-wearing, and very attractive. It is the same product that was used in the renovation of the women's and men's bathrooms. We have chosen a color that compliments the new wall color, a light beige with some gray modeling. The cost of the product and installation, for both the Fellowship Hall and the

hallways, is \$16,400. The cost of just the hallways, including the area in front of the Ruby Chapel, is \$9,800. This includes reinstalling the vinyl baseboard.


The impetus for this project is primarily safety, with the added benefit of updating the church with a beautiful, contemporary look. We have had several people fall in the hallway in the last year, and have already experienced our first incident of 2019. It is likely they tripped by catching their walker, cane or foot on the edge of the carpet runners. Therefore, we are attempting to eliminate that particular hazard. In addition, the new flooring would alleviate the need for costly strip and wax maintenance, and would help reduce long-term upkeep costs. For these reasons, we want to execute this project as soon as possible.

The Board of Trustees is asking the congregation to prayerfully consider donating to this very worthy project. We have approximately \$4,400 in our capital improvement account to kick-start the effort. When donating, please note "flooring project" on the memo line of your check.

We thank Linda and Jerry Kielsmeier, John Burrough, Larry Wood, John Rains, and all other volunteers involved in the hallway being painted. Also, a thank you to David Followwill for the many hours of research he invested in this project.

In the past, I have made references to a book called, <u>The Blessing</u>, by Gary Smalley and John Trent. It raises the issue about the negative impact of not receiving a blessing from significant people in our lives.

The example the book uses is from the Old Testament story about two brothers, Jacob and Esau, sons of Isaac, who was the son of Abraham. They were twins, but Esau was the first born and was in line to receive the birthright and blessing reserved for the first born. However, Jacob, with the help of his mother, Rebekah, tricked Isaac into giving the blessing meant for Esau to him (Genesis 27).

The book deals with the negative impact not receiving the intended blessing has on Esau. Authors Smalley and Trent go on to share the negative impact that occurs in the lives of all people who do not receiving a blessing from significant people in their lives.

It's too easy and too common in today's world to be negative and even tease by using "put downs" instead of blessings. But if you stop and think about it or have ever experienced it, there is so much joy to be found in both giving and receiving blessings.

It's been true throughout human history, but I think we can agree that our world today is in great need of sharing blessings. The sharing of blessings should be done in our homes, in our work places, with all our relatives, friends and neighbors. It should be done in our schools, our churches, and in our government. It should be done in our communities, our state, our nation, and our world.

From some reason this is not an easy task. It seems to go against some of our human nature—to protect, preserve, and put ourselves first. But it is also in line with another part of our human nature—to love, nurture, support, and care for others. We just need to be aware of which part of our nature we develop, feed, and cultivate.

It's still not long ago that we celebrated that "love came down at Christmas." Could it be that we need another reminder so soon? Yes, it doesn't hurt that February 14 is coming up and we are reminded once again of the love we are to show to others.

Valentine's Day, like Christmas, has a connection to the Christian faith. It is not as direct as Christmas, but Valentine's Day became linked to the Saint Day, February 14, of an early Christian martyr named St. Valentine.

Like Christmas, Valentine's Day has become very commercialized. But the positive side to this is that the message of loving others is promoted on a huge scale. As my professor friend, Dr. Bruce Forbes, has written in his book, <u>America's Favorite Holidays</u>, "If Valentine's Day has become one of America's most culturally dominant holidays, it must be because we in the general public value love and relationships, and we are eager to affirm them."

May it be so that we all are eager to affirm our love for others.
