


Every Monday and Wednesday at 9:30 a.m., join us for Chair Yoga Stretch (no fee).





Pastor Lilian sent us an Easter letter. She reminded us that New Hope United Methodist Church's mission statement is "Following Christ, inspiring minds, loving hearts, serving hands and impacting communities." She included a listing of 2022 Faith by Numbers. A few of the numbers listed were:

Total food items to Food Banks and Pantry -2,175

Total Grains from Grain Bin – 350 lbs.

Total Mission Monies Given to Local Mission - \$19,617

Total Work Hours Given to Local Mission – 1,000 hours (scheduled service projects)

Total Wednesday Children and Youth Programs – 37

Two bake sales were held and the proceeds were added to other donations to send to Hawthorn Hill, and to support New Hope Church with purchases of furnaces and the east addition to the church.

The members helped put together 96 "Days for Girls" kits which had been created by The Needlers at New Hope. Christmas cards were written for several shut-ins and personally delivered by the members.

We appreciate all of you who have made monthly pledges to this project until fully paid. All of your donations, regardless the amount, was and is, greatly appreciated!


