




Ingathering is November 4, 2023

The United Methodist churches in Iowa have celebrated Ingathering for many years. New Hope church has participated for several years taking quilts, student kits, personal dignity kits, birthing kits, and monetary gifts for blankets, etc.

This year, the Mission Committee has chosen to provide money for **Mobility Carts**. We have one here at New Hope for you to see and try out.

Mobility Worldwide provides **Mobility Carts** to individuals in over 106 countries. There are more than 70 million persons in the world who have lost the use of their legs through polio, landmines, war amputations, earthquake amputations, crocodiles, etc. Designed to function in rough terrain, and propelled by a hand-crank, these carts can go where conventional wheelchairs cannot. Many of these carts are made in Leighton, Iowa.

It costs approximately \$350 to build and ship one cart. The recipients pay nothing. It is through donations that this ministry can continue.

African Immigrants and Refugees Transition Services (www.airts.org) AIRTS is a non-profit organization founded by and for immigrants and refugees from Africa living in Iowa. Since 2016 they have been providing immigrants and refugees the resources they need to successfully settle in their new home/community. New Hope provides a small monthly donation, however, they are serving more and more clients and need funds to help with their program. They have applied for and received grants for their mission but need cash reserves to facilitate the use of the grants. Please consider donating by indicating on the memo line of your check to New Hope UMC the word AIRTS or by making a donation on their website: airts.org Thank you for your consideration.

Free Little Food Pantry ~ The need for food continues to grow in our community! DMARC reported that our zip code – 50310 – ranks second highest in the zip codes in the Des Moines metro with individuals needing assistance with food.

If we all bring one non-perishable food item each week to put on our pantry shelf, we can continue to take 30 food items per week to the Free Little Food Pantry in our Meredith Drive community.

Please no opened boxes or expired items. Canned fruit in light syrup is preferred.

The food placed in the Free Little Food Pantry stays on the shelf for less than 3 hours because the need is so great. Only non-perishable foods and no expired food products.

Remember to sign up for a Monday to take the 30 food items to the Free Little Food Pantry located between 51st and 52nd Streets north of Meredith Drive.

There is a clipboard with the sign-up sheet on the pantry shelf by our Welcome Center.

Fill the Red Barrel: Contributing to the red barrel is as easy as buying a few extra cans of food while you shop and bringing them to church with you. All food and personal care items collected by the Red Barrel Program goes to the DMARC Food Pantry Network. For a list of most needed items, go to https://www.dmarcunited.org. If you would rather give a monetary donation, please make your check out to New Hope UMC and include "Food Pantry" in the memo line and place your check with the offering.

Grain Bin: When the Grain Bin is full, the donations will be given to Johnston Partnership, Families Forward and the Urbandale Food Pantry, on a rotation schedule.

In 2023, monthly donations will be given to: Families Forward (formerly Bidwell Riverside), Missionary Dr. Mefor, Urbandale Food Pantry, DMARC Food Bank, Women at the Well, African Immigrant and Refugee Transition Services (AIRTS), and Johnston Partnership.




"RESTORE the COOL" campaign update as of 9/30/23.
