



Watch For The Giving Tree

In November, the Giving Tree will be available for the congregation to help give a child some warmth and joy over the Holidays. The Mission Team has chosen two charities to support again this Holiday Season:

- 1. **ORCHARD PLACE**: They are having "Keep Kids Warm Winter Drive" and need our help. A gift of \$60.00 gives the gift of warmth to a child who might otherwise go without. This will cover the cost of one coat, one pair of boots, one hat and one pair of gloves. On our "Giving Tree" will be tags in various amounts that you can choose to help keep kids warm. Just put your money in the envelope and the Mission Team will deliver all donations to Orchard Place.
- 2. **Families Forward (formerly Bidwell)**. Each year Bidwell has hosted the Holiday Toy Pantry and Families Forward is continuing the tradition. The Holiday Toy Pantry event gives away gifts to families in need throughout the month of December. Needed donations

for the Holiday Toy Pantry include toys and gifts for children ages 0 -17, Books, Hats & Gloves, Stocking Stuffers, Stuffed Animals, Quilts and Blankets and \$10 and \$20 gift cards to Walmart, Target, Amazon, etc. Again, tags for various needed items will be on the Giving Tree for you to choose for Families Forward Toy Pantry. **Do not wrap any of the gifts.** Bring the gifts to the Mission Center in Fellowship Hall and the Mission Team will deliver all donations to Families Forward.

Your check can be made out to New Hope UMC. Please add Orchard Place or Families Forward to the memo line. <u>All donations are needed by December 3.</u>

Free Little Food Pantry ~ The need for food continues to grow in our community! DMARC reported that our zip code – 50310 – ranks second highest in the zip codes in the Des Moines metro with individuals needing assistance with food.

If we all bring one non-perishable food item each week to put on our pantry shelf, we can continue to take 30 food items per week to the Free Little Food Pantry in our Meredith Drive community.

Please no opened boxes or expired items. Canned fruit in light syrup is preferred.

The food placed in the Free Little Food Pantry stays on the shelf for less than 3 hours because the need is so great. Only non-perishable foods and no expired food products.

Remember to sign up for a Monday to take the 30 food items to the Free Little Food Pantry located between 51st and 52nd Streets north of Meredith Drive.

There is a clipboard with the sign-up sheet on the pantry shelf by our Welcome Center.

Fill the Red Barrel: Contributing to the red barrel is as easy as buying a few extra cans of food while you shop and bringing them to church with you. All food and personal care items collected by the Red Barrel Program goes to the DMARC Food Pantry Network. For a list of most needed items, go to https://www.dmarcunited.org. If you would rather give a monetary donation, please make your check out to New Hope UMC and include "Food Pantry" in the memo line and place your check with the offering.

Grain Bin: When the Grain Bin is full, the donations will be given to Johnston Partnership, Families Forward and the Urbandale Food Pantry, on a rotation schedule.

In 2023, monthly donations will be given to: Families Forward (formerly Bidwell Riverside), Missionary Dr. Mefor, Urbandale Food Pantry, DMARC Food Bank, Women at the Well, African Immigrant and Refugee ransition Services (AIRTS), and Johnston Partnership.

East Entrance Addition ~ Financial Update




"RESTORE the COOL" campaign update as of 10/27/23.
