





What is Fresh Start Women's Center?

Women at the Well began a satellite ministry at Fresh Start during the pandemic when it was not possible to get inside the prison where the primary ministry happens. We offer a weekly program at Fresh Start called "Well Time" that features Bible Study, worship and small group support for the reentry journey of women in transition from

jail or prison. In the last year, we've developed a feeding ministry along with this, offering a home-cooked meal to the women twice a month on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month. (New Hope is providing the meal on February 13th.)

Fresh Start is a 48 bed facility run by the Department of Corrections for women in the justice system. It is a workrelease facility so everyone there is required to leave during the day to go to work to develop self-sufficiency. Meals at the center are only offered once a day and come from the men's facility: old and cold. We thought they could use a nice meal prepared with the love and care that many of our partner churches are known for.

The Care Team is mounting a drive for donated: Men's socks Men's underwear Men's gloves and winter scarves and bars of soap for the homeless clients that frequent Central Iowa Shelter and Services downtown.

Please prayerfully consider helping those less fortunate than us by donating the aforementioned items to help them stay warm when they're not at the shelter.

A bin for your donations is at the Missions Corner in the Fellowship Hall.

The Care Team appreciates your help. And we know those less fortunate than us will most definitely appreciate it too!

New Hope 2034 (Formerly Growth Team)

Purpose: Help identify events, activities, partnerships, and outreach opportunities that will assist New Hope United Methodist Church live its mission and grow into our shared vision.

Mission: Following Christ, inspiring minds, loving hearts, serving hands, and transforming communities.

Vision: Called to grow disciples of Jesus Christ by strengthening our Church Family and transforming communities.

CAT Priorities:

Make the necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our church.

Reaching new people and incorporating them into the church.

Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage in life. Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships.

Work to renew and revitalize the community around the church by building coalitions and partnerships.

New Hope 2034 Goals: Develop and energize the following action teams:

Facility Opportunity, Review and Exploration Team

Why: Our greatest tool is our facility. In 2005, our average Sunday attendance was approximately 300 people from all services. Today our average Sunday attendance is approximately 160 people from all services. This drop in attendance is part of a much larger trend across all denominations. It will be critical that New Hope develop activities and identify organizations/partnerships that require space for their operations to help us to continue to maintain and upgrade our facility. It will be important that these organizations/partnerships be aligned with our mission. Potential Projects: Refine Larry Wood's cost per square foot lease calculation. Preschool, DMARC Food Pantry partnership, existing non-profits. Develop grant portfolio.

Fresh Expressions Team

Why: Where have all the people gone? Only half of Americans attend any church during the year. This is down and still dropping from around 80% in the mid-2000s. "Emerging generations don't speak "Christianese" and typically have no life experience in the church." Like John Wesley before us, we will need to leave the comfort of church to reach new generations in the places where they have built their communities. These generations "may not know their neighbor but have built a network of friends on media platforms and meet in person to socialize". Potential Projects: Online bible studies, educate team and congregation. Develop implementation plan. How to release the APEs!

Bridges (Events and Activities and Community Coordination Team)

Why: To impact our community, we need to know our community. Holding events that attract our community in our space allows us to introduce ourselves to those living in our area. At the same time, it is important that in an increasingly complex world, we offer fellowship and assistance that not only encompasses our spiritual needs but attends to the practical needs of our world. How can we help navigate this highly technical world we have built. This team will work closely with our current Bridges program.

Potential Projects: Seminars around cybersecurity. Get to know your device seminars. We have a multi-purpose Family Life Center, how can this space be used for activities (afterschool, pickleball, etc.)? Breweries are now being built that allow parents or dog owners to have a space for either children or pets to play. *What if we offer a café and play space*? Develop community garden space.

Technology Forward Team

Why: To "connect" to current and future generations, we need to make sure that we have the tools for making connections. Our facility needs to have technology that is flexible and robust. Being technology forward will allow us to offer opportunities to engage younger generations in the functioning of our church. Having consistent messaging across all major platforms will help us tell our story and engage people in the places where they gather. Potential Projects: Identify, implement, and support technology. Assist in seminars as needed. Educate leaders on best practices and offer instruction on using social media for messaging.

Stewardship and Finance Update

The Stewardship and Finance Committee would like to thank the members of New Hope United Methodist Church for their support in 2023. Your giving helped us to reduce our 2023 projected deficit of \$24,000 to \$16,289.65. This deficit was covered by operating reserves.

Many thanks for participating in the pledge drive for 2024. We were both inspired and humbled by the results. We had 31 pledges increase their 2024 pledging by an average of 15%. As exciting, we had 11 new pledges for 2024. These are pledgers that have not pledged in the past. Many, many thanks to those that continue to give their time, talents, resources, and presence to our wonderful congregation. With the pledges for 2024, we feel confident that we can continue to close the gap between our giving and expenses.

As we dive into 2024, one area of concern is the increasing costs associated with our facility. For example, our insurance on our facility went from around \$12,000 to \$17,000. A whopping \$5,000 increase. Based on a recommendation from the New Hope 2034 Team (formerly the Growth Committee) a Facility Use Review team is being formed to actively seek out partnerships and activities that will help offset the cost of operating our wonderful facility. The Trustees will be providing the leadership and recruiting members that are interested in helping.

In February, we will be bringing back our Document and Donuts. Please look for the announcement in our Sunday bulletins. We will be revising some of the communication charts this year and will want to hear from you to see if they are useful.


