

The theme of our study this year will be the “one anothers” of Scripture. Thirty-five times in the New Testament we see a recurring word pattern: an action verb followed by the words “one another.” For example, “*Comfort one another*” (2 Corinthians 1:4), “*Forgive one another*” (Colossians 3:13), and “*Accept one another*” (Romans 15:7). The Bible says Jesus went about doing good. What good did Jesus do? The “one anothers” show the world how love behaves and what love looks like.

The Confirmation class will have their first class meeting on **September 11, 4:30-6:00 p.m.** The Confirmation program is designed to enable the Confirmation students to combine intellectual learning and experiential learning as we spend time together learning about and growing in the Christian faith.

Some of the key components that we have as a part of the program: students help lead in a worship service, they serve in such programs as the Hand of Luke meal to the shelter, and they have a chance to tour other churches and agencies to learn about other expressions of the Christian faith and mission work.

Another key component of our Confirmation experience is the “Mentor” process, in which we ask adult mentors to be with the youth during the class sessions. As one Christian leader said, the Christian faith is more caught than taught, and it is so very helpful for our Confirmation youth to spend some time with and have the Christian faith modeled by an adult who is also on their faith journey. I am so very grateful for the adults who are helping with this year’s Confirmation program.

We look forward to a year of learning, experiences and fun together in our Confirmation program.

WOMEN AT THE WELL a United Methodist congregation which is located within the walls of the Iowa Correctional Institution for Women, in Mitchellville, Iowa. They are a diverse community composed of women incarcerated at ICIW, men and women from around the State of Iowa who choose to worship with us, and many volunteers who regularly support our ministries and programs. They gather together to share the teachings of Jesus Christ, and to experience the life transforming Spirit of God.

Worship time is on Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the Sacred Place Chapel.

New Hope UMC is a partner to Women at the Well. We have signed a commitment to support them with our:

Prayers: We lift them up in prayer every Sunday worship and encourage our members to pray for them daily.

Presence: We visit once every year to one of their worship services.

Gifts: We give \$1 per member as part of our partnership.

Witness: We have 2 reentry teams that have helped and supported women to return to society after incarceration.

We are presently waiting for new re entry gals.

Service: Women at the Well encourages people to volunteer helping with a variety of things and also teaching arts and crafts.



LOUISIANA FLOODS: Because of the devastating floods in Louisiana, UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) has activated help in that area. You can give to this disaster by indicating "Floods" on the memo line of your check to New Hope UMC.

HOPE AWAY FROM HOME

It is the end of summer, the Sate Fair is over, vacations have ended, teachers and students are preparing for school, and the local stores have all their summer items on clearance.

I love asking people what they did for the summer. The list is always diverse: Disney, Camping, Cruise, Family, None, New York, California, Europe. I am usually jealous cause I love to travel, to experience diversity, new cultures, and although some have a hard time believing it, I actually do like to slow down and relax. But one of the most common statements I hear when people share their story is, "It was a wonderful place to visit, but I would not want to live there." This statement teaches us the value of home, the importance of having a place where we belong, where the people, the landscape, the community, and culture all feel as if they are intimately woven into the fabric of our identity.

A group of us went to Detroit last month on a mission trip and experienced this in a profound way, but I think we also witnessed the other side of reality. The individuals whose homes we worked on felt completely at home even in the midst of a broken system, abandoned businesses, depreciated home values, and low or no income. It made me wonder what the Israelites might have felt during the Exile when God told them to put down roots in a foreign land while some remained at home in a land of ruins. I began asking myself the question where is the hope? How should we handle stress tension and conflict? How do we endure in a situation of life that makes us feel like we are living in a foreign land?

You don't have to move from one nation to another to feel this tension or discomfort with where life has plopped you, it may have snuck up on you when you weren't looking, you may have been busy at work and didn't notice the changing surroundings of home, life, friends, or family.

Maybe a more challenging subject for some is the awareness of the growing number of refugees and immigrants seeking a new home. Can we relate to what these families have gone through? Do we understand the pain and loss? Is it possible to grapple with the concept of feeling like we don't fit anywhere, our family is not safe, and we have nowhere that feels like home anymore?

How can the Church offer Hope, be a Home, and an inclusive family for all people wherever we travel? How do we become something more than borders, ethnicity, lifestyle, and language? How do we become the Kingdom of God, filled with Hope away from Home? Join the Biblical and challenging discussion of being an Exile.

It began with our annual statewide United Methodist Conference the first weekend of June. This was the last conference with our current bishop, Bishop Julius Trimble. He has completed two four year terms with us and has now been reassigned to serve the Indiana Conference. Our new bishop is Bishop Laurie Haller, who will begin her service in Iowa on September 1. She is coming from Michigan and members of our New Hope/JROL mission team that worked in Detroit the second week of August got to meet and have a meal with her and her husband, who is also a pastor. We look forward to her coming and leading our conference.

Also in June, JROL held Vacation Bible School and the Senior Blast youth group went on their annual mission trip. The Senior Blast went to Rapid City, South Dakota the week of June 26 to July 2. We served a meal at a community center started by the downtown United Methodist Church as a place for those who are homeless to do activities, store belongings, receive mail, and receive help looking for jobs. We also helped sort donations at a Salvation Army Thrift Store, meeting and working with many people there. We helped with activities at a church affiliated nursing home, helped clean an historic church, and helped sort and salvage donations at a Habitat for Humanity Restore. One of our fearless leaders, Chris Higdon, led the group in raising over \$800 for the Restore by scrapping metal! We also had sightseeing trips to historic locations (two trips to Mt. Rushmore) and finished our work by serving over 200 people at an outdoor cookout. We chose to do a high ropes course and zip line for our "fun" activity. I enjoyed leading an adult class in a study of the major world religions, comparing them with Christianity. I can make handouts and videos available to those who are interested.

I took some personal time at the end of July and the first two weeks of August. If you don't know, the last full week of July is annually reserved for Ragbrai, the bike ride across Iowa. I don't go every year, but I have gone the last nine years in a row and have gone twenty-one times out of the forty-four Ragbrais that have been held. It's become a "bad habit" for me (that's actually a good habit I think).
