New Hope UMC has been blessed with wonderful weather for our Sunday Parking Lot Services. We are thankful for everyone that has attended the services. As cold weather is upon us, New Hope's Transition Team is making a few changes to our Sunday services.

We understand that during these uncertain times, not everyone is comfortable attending indoor worship services. Because of this, New Hope will continue to offer simulcasted radio broadcasts to the parking lot for all indoor services. Additionally, we will continue to provide prerecorded services that will be posted on Facebook and emailed out on Sunday morning.

Starting Sunday, November 8th, New Hope will be moving all services indoors.

- The 9:00 am service will be moving indoors to the Family Life Center and will be simulcasted to the parking lot.
- The 10:30 am service will be moving indoors to the Sanctuary and will be simulcasted to the parking lot.

This will allow both Pastor Lilian and the musicians to share their talents from the heated building on the cold mornings; while still giving the option for people to listen to the service from their vehicles in the parking lot of New Hope. We invite people that are comfortable coming indoors, wearing a mask, and willing to social distance; to join Pastor Lilian in either the Family Life Center or Sanctuary. Additionally, Charity Johnson, Children's Ministry Coordinator, will be moving the 10:30 am Sunday School offering indoors, using our Sunday School rooms.

Finally, we would like to remind everyone that New Hope has adopted a mandatory face covering while indoors. Also, for your safety, we will have seating configured to allow socially distant seating and we will be refraining from singing in the Sanctuary.

If you have questions or concerns about the changes coming because of the colder weather; please contact Clark Howland (clarkhowland@msn.com), chair of the transition team. The transition team is continuing to meet regularly to discuss and continue to refine New Hope's response to this global pandemic.




At this point Bidwell continues to cancel group-volunteering events through December.






Stewardship Beyond 2020

At the beginning of 2020 (in what seems like a different world now) the Stewardship and Finance Committee developed our first year-round Stewardship Plan. The intent was to focus on monthly stewardship moments through testimonies both in the LINK and at our services. This was a change from only hearing testimonies during the pledging month of November. Why wait to hear the good news of how New Hope impacts our members lives when we have eleven other months at our disposal?

Like most, because of Covid-19 we have had to make some adjustments to our Stewardship plan. With one exception we have been able to keep our plan intact. In September, we had planned to talk with the congregation about stewardship in face-to-face groups where ideas or concerns can be explored and discussed. Obviously with Covid-19 we were not able to do this. The Committee then chose to attempt to develop a survey.

As we completed our research on a stewardship survey, it became apparent that it was going to be difficult to do a separate stewardship survey without asking deeper questions about New Hope. There were surveys related to money and why individuals pledge or do not pledge, but when it came to asking how effective a stewardship program is, the questions then spill over into the deeper questions we had hoped to discuss during the small groups.

We then did additional research on a more comprehensive tool or tools that would help not only answer stewardship but give us a better understanding of New Hope. The leadership of New Hope believes that there is value to New Hope to consider this path. Because of Covid we are presented not only with significant short-term challenges, but also with new future opportunities. The survey will help New Hope to identify these new opportunities and take a more holistic approach to New Hope's mission.

Granted a more comprehensive survey will be much larger than a short stewardship survey. We feel that it is important that we use this moment to capture our member's hopes and concerns as we move forward beyond Covid-19. For the results to be meaningful, we will need to have as many members participate in the survey as possible. We are planning for the survey to have the ability to be completed in the format (paper, online, etc.) that best suits the member's preference.


After reviewing various surveys and options, we will be engaging the Iowa Conference Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT) program (<https://www.iaumc.org/CAT>). This program will allow New Hope to use our members as the drivers of the process and use the free services of the conference to assist in the data gathering.

We are still in the planning stages, so we will be spending the next two months communicating and developing a frequently asked question sheet to keep everyone informed. The current goal will be to start the survey in late January/early February.

Our intent is that everyone will have the opportunity to express their desires, hopes and aspirations for our blessed New Hope Community. With our members support we can use the survey results to guide our planning, missions, and activities as we move into the new world of post-Covid.

New Hope United Methodist Church (UMC) offers an opportunity for legacy giving through its endowment. By including the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund in your will or estate, you make a significant contribution in strengthening our church's vital mission, both locally and around the world.

An endowment is the time-honored method of allocating certain gifts to an investment fund. When you leave assets to the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund, your gift will become a legacy of annual giving to New Hope UMC in perpetuity. This gift provides the assurance you are helping secure the church's wellbeing, ministries and mission for generations to come.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is an endowment fund?

An endowment is different from other types of funds – such as operating or capital funds – in that accumulated assets are invested in perpetuity. An endowment provides the church with access to resources to grow its mission beyond our lifetimes. Part of the satisfaction is knowing you can make a lasting impact, a generational legacy.

How would my gift to the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund be used?

Your gift and those of others will be collected into a fund that is intended to exist in perpetuity. Distributions from interest, or returns from the total invested fund will be made to support five key areas: Worship, work programs, local outreach, education and facilities.

How will the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund be invested?

The New Hope UMC Endowment Fund is invested with the Iowa United Methodist Foundation (IUMF). The Endowment Fund is intended to be invested prudently, according to the IUMF Social Principles, which dictate no investments are made in companies involved in alcohol, tobacco, for-profit prisons or gambling.



Who makes investment and distribution decisions for the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund?

Investment and distribution of the New Hope UMC Endowment Fund and the earnings will be determined by the Endowment Committee. Because the fund is intended to exist in perpetuity, more secure, fixed-income assets – such as bonds – will serve as the foundation that will eventually be augmented with non-bond investment vehicles that include both U.S. and international equities.
