East Entrance Addition ~ Update

This message is intended to bring the congregation up-to-date referencing the East Entrance Addition building project. There has been \$41,270 pledged (32% of total amount required) with \$17,650 received (14% of total amount required) to support the building of a drive under canopy, named as the **East Entrance Addition**. The Board of Trustees has unanimously approved this project to move forward to the Administrative



Council for their consideration. On the 25th of February, the Administrative Council voted unanimously to approve the project. They also approved to use the Iowa United Methodist Foundation for the construction loan and to turn the remaining amount owed into a longer term loan, once the construction is finished. The next steps are to sign the Contractor's contract and to request the building loan.




Despite the cancellation and cold weather, we were able to have an impressive ending score in our game!




Renaming the Family Life Center (FLC)

- **We encourage all household members older than age 12 to complete a survey. We want to know what our youth are thinking.**
- Please do not discuss the survey or your answers with others as this may influence their answers.
- **Budget about 30 minutes** to complete the survey. The online survey must be **completed in one session.** Unfortunately, there is not the ability to come back and finish an incomplete survey.
- If you do have to abandon the survey, you may begin anew by simply clicking the link.
- **CONFIDENTIALITY: All answers are completely anonymous.** We have no way to match any assessment to a particular person, so please feel free to candidly share your perceptions, opinions, and experiences. Our future together depends on your participation and honest answers.
- **Sunday, March 14, is the final day the survey will be available.**

If you still wish to complete the survey via paper, you can:

- Ask for a copy as you leave either the indoor service or as you exit the parking lot. Or,
- Call the church office at 278-2097 to request a copy. We will mail it to you.

25 Year Milestone for Hand of Luke

Did you know that **March 14th will mark the 25th anniversary** of the first meal New Hope served at the Central Iowa Shelter & Services? We would like to share the history of the Hand of Luke program. The following was provided by Ruth Doxon, one of the founding members of this program.

The Hand of Luke mission involves the collection of food, preparation and serving the evening meal at Central Iowa Shelter and Services on the 14th of each month. The Hand of Luke mission came out of an adult Sunday School group whose focus at the time was social issues. They discussed what New Hope could do that was mission based and served individuals locally. The one which we agreed would provide an impact and an opportunity for nearly all members of the church community was preparing and serving meals at a local shelter.



On December 28, 1995 Betty Schoondyke, Cathy Beck-Cross and Ruth Doxon were given the opportunity to join another church in serving the evening meal at Churches United Shelter (since renamed to Central Iowa Shelter and Services). Our purpose was to participate in the evening meal program, review the kitchen facility, determine what was expected of volunteers, how other churches made the mission work for them and to determine if such a mission was feasible for New Hope.

The decision was made to move forward and to name it “Hand of Luke”. New Hope was able to secure the 14th of each month as their day of support. The value in having the same calendar date each month meant the day of the week varied from month to month thereby increasing the opportunity for individuals to volunteer.

On March 14th, 1996 the first meal was served. It was a simple menu of turkey and noodles, mashed potatoes, corn, and cake. Notes from that original plan stated the following: *“We chose this menu as the first because it seemed easy and Rev. Bob has indicated there are two frozen turkeys in the church kitchen that we can have. The plan is to see if Mike Warren (Aunt Vi’s pasta) will donate the egg noodles. There are some large sheet cake pans at the church so making the cake shouldn’t be that hard.”*

What changes have occurred since that first meal? Initially we planned for up to 75 individuals. We quickly learned to bump that up to 100 as many of the clients desired second servings. From there it was bumped to 125 individuals, then 150, and currently we plan on up to 225 individuals.


We also learned what foods to avoid that are served repeatedly by others. For example, great pride was taken in May 1996 to have a sit-down meal (with the youth serving) that included ham slices, baked potatoes and green bean casserole. Easter was not that far past and while appreciative of the hot food, this was the 3rd serving of ham in the past week. When serving casseroles, we have learned to provide a vegetarian or chicken-based alternative, particularly when pork is involved. The issue of homelessness is diverse in who it impacts. We have learned that comfort foods like meatloaf made from scratch and ham balls are extremely popular as they are not served as frequently.

We have learned that in addition to feeding the hungry we feed the soul. In the very early years the servers experienced a gentleman who was upset that we had no cherry pie remaining when he came thru the line. The initial unspoken response was to wonder why he was being greedy rather than thankful. A member of the team pointed out that we all have our favorites and when given a choice would gravitate towards them. We found the meal often brings back a fond memory. One evening several years ago a middle-aged client approached and asked about the cupcake he had been given. It was a spice cupcake and he said it reminded him of his mother who had passed away but had prepared them for him as a child. He was grateful.

You are invited to participate in this worthwhile mission. Each month there is a need for cooks and drivers to prepare and deliver the meal to the shelter. (Due to the Pandemic, we are currently not serving.) We sometimes ask for dessert donations as well. Not sure about your ability to help? We intentionally mix our experienced cooks and drivers with new volunteers to help them gain confidence. We find that many times new volunteers quickly become regulars helping with this mission.

During the Pandemic, we have been relying on cash donations to purchase the food. You can simply notate HOL on the memo line of your check or go to the church website to donate.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the Hand of Luke mission over the years and thank you in advance for your continued support in 2021.



Dear Friends of New Hope:


I hope this note finds you all well in body and in spirit.
