


Day of Celebration Sunday, September 12th


10 Parables of Jesus by Jamie Buckingham

The Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church “Ingathering” will be held November 6, 2021. The purpose of Mission Ingathering is to show the Love of Christ to the world’s people by ministering to their needs. This year our Missions Committee will participate by contributing Birthing Kits.

Birthing Kit includes:

- 1 bar soap, 3 to 4 oz
- 2 receiving blankets. 28”x28” to 32”x32”. No crib, fleece or thermal blankets
- 1 pair gloves - surgical or thin rubber gloves
- 1 one-gallon resealable plastic bag
- 1 square yard clear plastic sheeting—no trash bags or shower curtains *This has already been donated*
- 3 pieces cotton string—each 12” long. *This has already been donated*
- 1 Razor Blade—single edge—cover in paper or cardboard to prevent injury *This has already been donated*

For the month of SEPTEMBER, we will collect bars of soap—3 to 4 oz plus continue to collect Receiving Blankets—28”x28” to 32”x32”. No crib, fleece or thermal blankets. Please place in the container on the Missions table in the Fellowship Hall.

Monthly checks continue to be sent to: Bidwell Riverside, Women at the Well, African Immigrant and Refugee Transition Services (AIRTS), missionary Dr. Emmanuel Mefor, Des Moines Area Religious Council (DMARC), Johnston Partnership and Urbandale Food Pantry.

This month we are highlighting **Johnston Partnership**

Johnston Partnership serves families and individuals in Johnston who are at-risk due to financial insecurity. They do this by creating programs to address specific needs in the community. The Partnership also serves as a catalyst for uniting local organizations and individuals to provide services that are not currently available through other resources: Food Assistance—Food Pantry is open to all families. They offer 3-day supply of food; personal care products.

Clothing Closet—allow 5 clothing items per family member per month for free

School Based Programming—mentoring for students grades 5—12 plus weekend food support

Benevolence Fund—for rental assistance, utility assistance and other emergency financial needs

- Work is finished on our brand new East Entrance, giving us a grand Entrance and drive-up canopy to welcome us and visitors to New Hope every day.


Enhancing our programs and being dutiful stewards of our facilities means our pledged support is all the more important.
