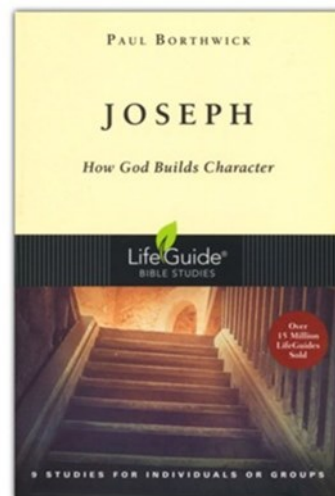
Joseph Bible Study is Postponed

Join Armenta and Linda for nine weeks of Bible Study on Mondays at 1 p.m. beginning Monday, March 7.

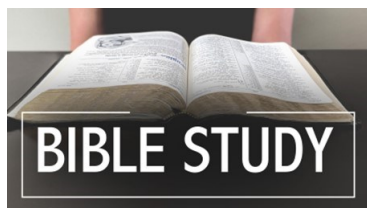

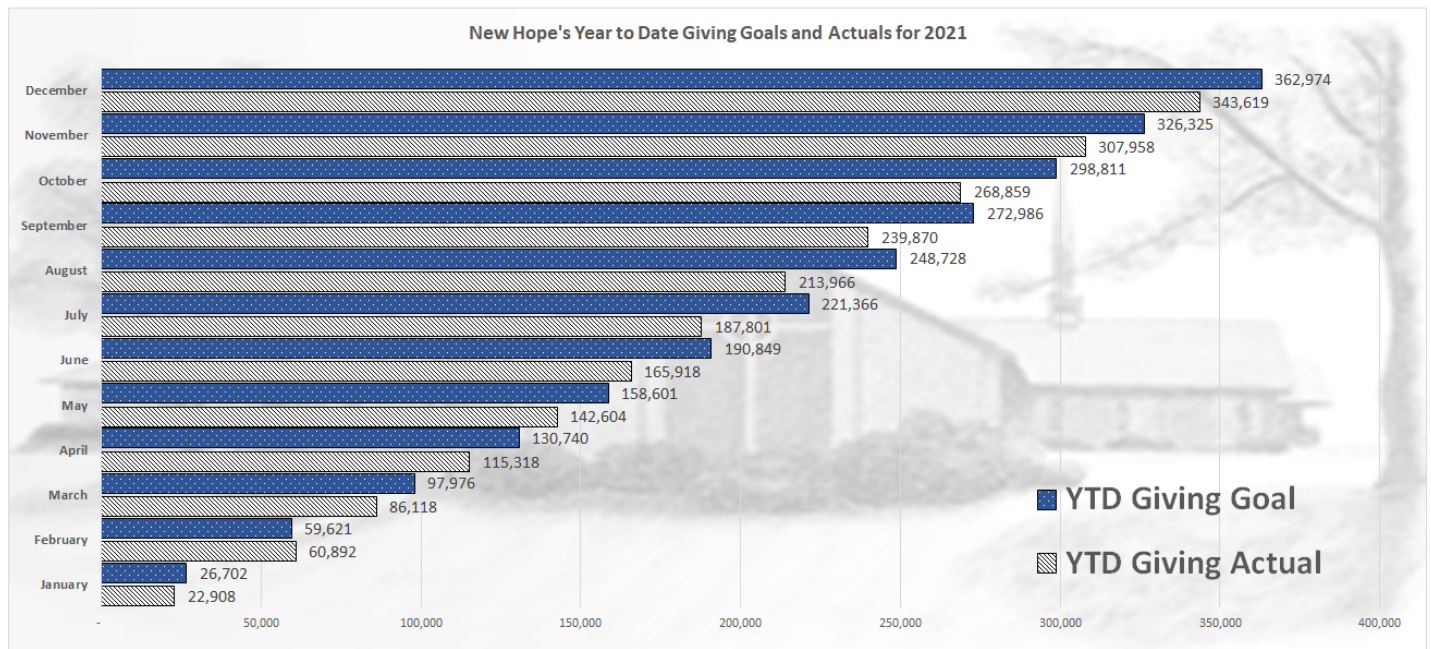
