Leading Now and Into the Future

Led by the Vision (<https://www.iaumc.org/leading-now-vision>) as articulated by the Bishop and Appointive Cabinet, Pastor Lilian started the conversation here at New Hope UMC last February 21st with twenty-seven New Hope UMC members in attendance. We are asking every member of this congregation to attend these conversations. Of course, the ideal is to have you all come to the four scheduled and Pastor-led conversations.

Even though you missed the first one, please take time to come to the next three – **February 27th, March 21st and March 28th at 6:30 p.m. and ends at 7:45.** The Vision articulated by Bishop and Appointive Cabinet is available in printed form upon request. The February 21st Power Point prepared by our Pastor is available in printed form upon request.

Here is an outline of the steps we are taking as part of our response to the Vision:

STEP 1 - Decide on how we respond as a congregation – Are we going to support same sex marriage being held at our spaces and conducted by our Pastor? 1.a – Four Conversations are facilitated by our Pastor so that everyone has the opportunity to hear and to be heard. 1.b – A Task Force is put together to create a draft of what New Hope UMC wants to publicly articulate as our missional affirmation in regard to same sex marriage. 1.c – Conversations will be facilitated by the Task Force at various groups, committees and Boards so that all people are given a time to examine our expressed affirmation in written form. 1.d – Schedule and hold an All Church Conference to decide by a prayerfully-discerned vote of confidence on our missional affirmation in relation same sex marriage.

STEP 2 – Hopefully, by the time we have completed STEP 1, the General Conference convened, voted and the birthing of new bodies have started. New Hope UMC will decide where to best align what we decided as our congregational missional affirmation in relation to same sex marriage. This will be, of course, finalized at an All Church Conference. Hopefully, to complete STEP 1 will make STEP 2 a shorter process.

May the Spirit be with us along the way.




Joseph, How God Builds Character Bible Study: *There are two options for this 9-week bible study at church.*

Come hungry and bring your favorite potluck dish to share! There will be plenty of food, good conversation, and planning for the future growth of New Hope.



East Entrance Addition ~ Update

The East Entrance Addition has received tremendously positive comments, especially referencing the usefulness, the appearance and how it complements the overall church building.

As of January 31, 2022, \$73,497.66 was donated. All of your donations, regardless the amount, was and is, greatly appreciated!

The actual cost of the addition and other improvements was \$134,304.00, leaving approximately \$68,095.17 on the long term loan. We appreciate all of you who have made monthly pledges to this project until fully paid.

Current loan balance as of 1/31/22 is \$62,361.02 as an additional principal payment was made using donated funds of \$5,451.21.


Missions will cover 1/2 or up to \$200 for each registration.
