How you can serve from home:

Midwest Mission is our partner for the United Methodist Church annual **INGATHERING** the first week in November. New Hope has been involved with Ingathering for many years – last year we contributed \$2,858 for Mobility Carts.

Midwest Mission is an UMCOR Cooperating depot, and also partner with many other nonprofits. They regularly ship three to four containers of humanitarian relief each month, domestically and internationally. Other nonprofits that partner for Ingathering are: Self-Help International; Heifer Project; Mobility Worldwide; Church World Service Blanket Project.

Camperships ~ Make sure you get your child registered for camp this summer! Last year New Hope had eight young people going to camp.

Missions will cover ½ or up to \$200 for each registration.

Free Little Food Pantry ~ Located between 51st and 52nd Streets north of Meredith Drive.

The extreme cold of Iowa winters requires a shift in food pantry items. **Suggestions:** Dry Soup mixes – Dry gravy mix – Boxed meals (similar to hamburger or tuna helper) – Instant Mashed Potatoes – Rice and boxed/bagged rice sides – Oatmeal and flavored oatmeal packets – Hot cereal (Cream of Wheat, Coco Wheat) – Cereal/cereal bars/pop tarts – Raman Noodle Packs or Cup O’ Soup, dry instant Soups – Cornbread or muffin mix – Mac N Cheese boxed meal – Dried beans – Pasta – Dried fruits.

We have increased our giving of weekly food donations to **50** items per week! Please keep your donations coming as the need for food is so great. Also, your help in delivering is appreciated. Just sign up on the clipboard on the top shelf.


